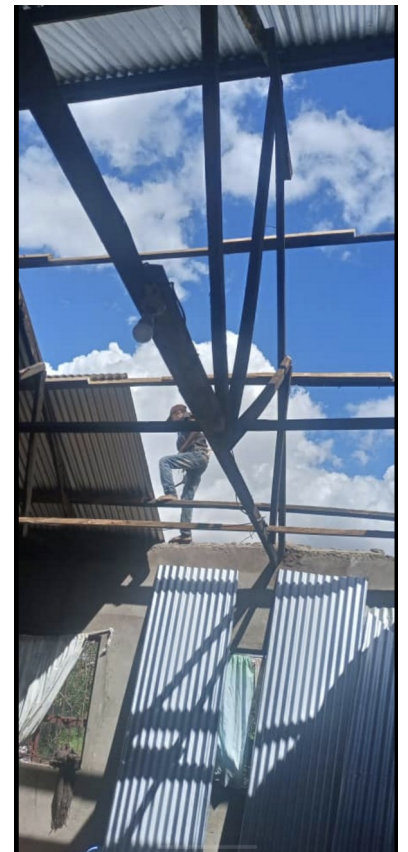

En novembre, le bus est tombé en panne. Les pluies torrentielles rendaient la circulation très difficile, une autre aide d'urgence été envoyée directement par Anne et Yvon Klein afin de permettre aux enfants de parcourir les 10km qui les séparent du campus sud de l'école.



L'école nous a de plus envoyé un récapitulatif détaillé de la situation de l'école, avec les deux campus, un listing des enseignants, et quelques photos. Il nous ont également envoyé un rappel de leurs difficultés. Ces deux documents sont reproduits en annexe de ce rapport moral.

**AGED:** 9 years

Overaged for standard 1 but should be given an opportunity to learn.

### **BACKGROUND:**

The boy was left by his father since the age of ten months and has been living with his mother and grandfather who apparently is blind due to diabetes.

### **MOTHER - PRISCILA ELIAS MOLLEL:**

His mother has serious health problems which she acquired after a tetanus injection was wrongly administered. Priscila is the first born in a family of three.

Due to their many challenges the boy Samiri Yasini Kusaka was left without schooling. He was supposed to start schooling at the age of 6 but was left till the age of 9 and is still not yet in school.

I believe in every child being given an opportunity to learn. It is unfortunate that Samiri has for a long time been deprived of the opportunity.

I appeal to goforintegrity association to give the boy a chance and doing so would be giving him a life. There is no future without education and here is a child before us without a choice but yielding to circumstances created by a group of challenged adults.

The mother brought the boy to school pleading for her son to be given an opportunity to learn, at least she had some sense. She tried.

Evaline had lost her father five years ago when she was in Pre-unit Class.

Her mother is a hawker selling second hand clothes from one place to another.

Evaline is now in Std. IV doing her National Examinations this year.

Her father was robbed and killed at gunpoint. He was a builder and contractor, working hard to earn a living. Immediately after being paid for a successful contract building. He was ambushed by robbers and left dead. They took everything and left him lying dead.

Evaline and her mother have moved on coping up with the different changes' that life brings

. She is good in her studies and works very hard. The school provided some assistance but can no longer do so.

We appeal for any one to sponsor her as she has a long way ahead of her

**HISTORY:**

The late father and husband of Gabriel Mkama Katura was a Police Detective in the CID Department.

He was shot during a gunfight against robbers on 30/04/2021. Gabriel is the last born in a family of five. The siblings are all going to various schools with 1 of them pursuing tertiary education.

The mother has always been a housewife who now has become a street vender selling vegetables in order to support her family.

Gabriel needs a sponsor for the last five years of his Primary Education.

**GABRIEL MKAMA KATURA:**

Gabriel just like his Dad would like to be a Police Officer when he grows up and completes school and continue the fight against crime.

He tries his best in school and has very high expectations.

## Situation de l'école, par l'école :

We are very grateful to you all for your concern, support and empathy that you show when we discuss the school. The delay to the reply is due to electricity power cuts affecting the whole nation. We have power cuts that have affected even our farms as we use electricity to pump water.

Integrity School has two campuses. The first campus is located in Daraja Mbili familiar to some of you and the second campus is located in Mkonoo which is some 10km from the first school.

### DARAJA MBILI CAMPUS:



This school is for the lower classes. This is the school where most of the videos I send are recorded. The school used to be our house and we made some renovations to accommodate classes. Being a residential area it has very limited space and the classes that are there are as follows:

#### 1. Baby Class:

This is a class for beginners and most of the children in this class are aged 3 and 4 years old. Their teacher is Mr. Raymond Mbise. He is a qualified teacher teaching Reading, Writing, Arts and Numbers.

#### 2. Nursery & Preschool:

Nursery & Preschool pupils are aged 4 to 5 years old and are still in their early stages of learning. These are still young and cannot sustain the hectic of long distance travel. Though some are driven to school but very few of them.

Their teacher is madam Lilian Mollel teaching them and developing the skills that started when they were in Baby Class. The following is a picture of Madam Lilian and her class.



Baby Class/Nursery and Pre Unit normally leave school at 1300 hours everyday. Whereas Std. I to VII leave school each day at 1500 hours.



Children submitting their books to the teacher. This is for pupils aged 4 to 5 years old. Some of them are still writing and some of them have just completed their work.

The teacher appears in the picture below as well.



Madam Lilian Mollel is the class teacher of both Nursery and Pre-unit class. The classes mentioned are both in the pre - primary levels.

In Daraja Mbili the place where these classes are located there are a total of 20 small children being handled by two teachers namely Mr. Raymond and Madam Lilian.

We have some other pupils but they are located in Mkonoo and will get back to them later.

The teachers exercise a lot of patience waiting for their dues as delays are always there due to economic hardships resulting in the many changes happening locally and globally. Most of our pupils' parents earnings are hand to mouth hence struggle with school fees payment.

### 3. STANDARD ONE CLASS:

These are children ready to be in the first year of Primary Studies and are aged from 5 to 6 years old. They are in their first year of primary studies. They are taught by Mr. Goodluck Mkonyi, photo appears below:

The class has 20 children but only 5 of these children have completed school fees payment the rest it is a struggle.

#### 4. STANDARD TWO:



The age of these students is from 6 to 7 years old and this is the second stage of acquiring and developing skills in Primary School level they are taught by Madam Elizabeth Mollel.

She has been working for the school for more than ten years. She is a faithful teacher and in addition to teaching she is in charge of the school environment.

Times have been hard and challenging but we celebrate her stay and service despite the challenges faced by the school.

Std. II has 21 pupils and out of these only 10 pupils parents manage to pay complete school fees. The remaining struggle to complete the fees.

## 5. STANDARD THREE:



These are aged from 6 to 7 years and there are 24 children in this class. Their class teacher is Madam Loveness Njiro. In addition to being the class teacher she is the school Academic Teacher and is responsible for Examinations and Tests. She has been working in this school for five years now.

Of the 24 pupils she has in her class, 10 of the pupils parents fail to pay school fees and it is a struggle to follow and monitor their payments.

Sometimes pupils are removed from classes hence affecting their outcome. It is challenging.

## 6. STANDARD FOUR:



These are aged 8 to 9 years old. They are in an examination class where they have to seat for SFNA - (Standard IV National Examinations). There are 17 pupils in this class with six pupils having serious school fees payment issues. Their class teacher is as well the Head of the school madam Grace Shirima.

Madam Grace Shirima is one of the longest serving teachers in our school. She has served the school for more than ten years. She is in charge of the staff and represents the school on several occasions in government forums and meetings.

The staff have learnt to be patient and tolerant in delayed salaries which adversely affects their lives.

Ladies/women are more tolerant than men. We appreciate and celebrate the tolerance shown by these valiant women.

Currently, classes Baby, Nursery/Pre to Standard IV are in Daraja Mbili.

Daraja Mbili has limited space to play and the government would like us to move the whole school to Mkonoo an exercise delayed due to many factors though the major one is financial.



## MKONOO CAMPUS:

This is where the plan to shift the whole school so it stays in one area is. The picture below is the site plan of the whole area in Mkonoo.



This is the plan of the biggest area that we have and is the area under development. This is where we do our farming and animal rearing and breeding. It is quite extensive and hard to maintain. It is not yet fenced and it leads to crops being stolen,

animals that we breed attacked and stolen. Recently our animal shelters were robbed we lost all the ducks and some rabbits. It is very sad.

We need the bus to move students from Daraja Mbili to Mkonoo a distance of 10km. We have around 18 children coming from Mkonoo to Daraja Mbili because we have not yet built lower classes there. These use the bus as well.

Standard VII pupils are the ones who take residence in Boarding for their final year of study. This is to avoid their studies being affected by weather changes and regular bus damages. Hence we keep them in boarding.

Standard IV pupils only go during the days of their National Examinations. This year they are scheduled on 25<sup>th</sup> and 26<sup>th</sup> October 2023.



## 7. STANDARD V:

There are 19 children in Standard V and of these complete school fees payment has only been done by parents of only 7 pupils. Making it hard for us to run the school and prepare for developmental plans.

The class teacher is Mr. Jastin. He is a committed teacher who loves his profession very much. He still has claims just like all the other teachers of unpaid salary arrears of more than two months. We try to talk to the teachers asking them to be tolerant as they wait for their salaries and indeed when parents make payments we make sure that we pay our staff.



It is hard for most of our teachers to go by waiting not knowing when they would be paid, and we suffer the pain of delayed payments due to a service we hoped would pay itself.

We appreciate you and all you do because the sponsorship you give to some of these children helps us a lot to take care of our staff.

## 8. STANDARD SIX:



Due to hard follow-ups on pupils of standard VI we lost some children because parents could not stand the pressure. They sent them to other schools leaving us with unpaid fees which we hope one day they will be cleared.

Standard VI has 12 students and of these 6 completed the fees the others have failed to pay. Making it hard for us to care for our teachers.

Madam Beatrice NNko is a new teacher and a graduate she completed her studies last year and looks forward to being paid on time in her new experience of the working world.

She is the Academic teacher and takes care of all academic activities in the Mkonoo Campus.

The other remaining teachers in Mkonoo area are Mr. Abel, Mr. Dawn Andrew and Madam Agness.



This is a photo of our PrePrimary Class in Mkonoo with their teacher madam Agness. Their class is yet to be completed as it is still under construction.

We thought of beginning a class for the little ones 10km away from the classes they ought to attend.



This is a PrePrimary Section that we have started developing in Mkonoo and our plan is to build three classes for the young ones in Mkonoo area.



The picture below shows an aerial view of a section of the school.



The vast land farming and animal rearing has been under the charge of Mr. Dawn Andrew. He is a Std. VII teacher teaching Science, English and Mathematics at std. VII level.

This year we had 19 STD. VII students who went away with unpaid school fees of 4,5 million. This has always been the case year after year.

We have planted maize seeds but the scorching sun is drying up almost everything and we cannot water the land due to power problems. A very challenging task.



Mr. Abel is a new teacher and a graduate who hates his salary being delayed and he appreciates being paid early and on time.

He teaches Vocational Skills, Civic and Moral Education and Social Studies in Classes 6 and 7.

Whereas the other subjects are taught taught by Mr. Jastin and Madam Beatrice.





Ana Surumbu has been working with us for more than ten years. She is the school cook and Matron. She is humble and works well but looks forward to her salary never being delayed.

The other photos are photos of the pupils and teachers of Mkonoo Campus taken as a collective photo.



These are standard V and VI pupils who use the school bus from Daraja Mbili to Mkonoo a distance of 10km from Monday to Friday.

The picture below is that of standard VII pupils who were in Boarding and just completed their National Examinations.



Our bus is in a very deplorable state. Due to these daily challenges we fail even to conduct Graduation Ceremonies for our deserving students. Seven years of Primary Schooling without an occasion is a pain for most parents. But we are many times so torn apart by other needs that seem to be more important for the school to run.



Dear Friends, as I write to you yesterday there was a tyre burst forcing us to pack the school Bus and hiring public transport and the charge per day for now is too much burden for the school. Our situations and circumstances are heart breaking but we cannot afford to despair. We have to move on. We are very grateful for friends like you

We have in Mkonoo Campus 4 teachers, one Cook and a Bus driver a total of 6 staff members and a total of 37 children excluding Std. VII's who left this year to care for.

Daraja Mbili Campus we have 8 teachers, two cooks, 1 watchman and 101 students.

The school has 138 children, 12 teachers, 3 cooks, 1 watchman, 1 storekeeper and 1 driver a total of 156 people. All these should be fed everyday two meals before they go home.

Thanks for all your supporting and all you are doing, you are impacting a nation through these children. Your contributions, your followups on our posts and your reviews makes us feel loved and appreciated. Thank you so much.

## Email d'Andrew Mwaipopo, le directeur de l'école

The association has been a very tremendous support to the school and we greatly appreciate your sacrifice and so much that you watch our videos though they could be boring sometimes.

To start Integrity School we gave up our house. The place you visited with Anne and Zoe used to be our house that we later sacrificed to give hope to Tanzanian children educating them at a fee we thought would be affordable. We got a loan from the Bank to build the other school that is 10km away from the baby school. Well, we thought that the affordable fees would run the school but world events such as COVID and the shifting of the upper classes from Daraja Mbili to Mkonoo led to an exodus of some students. They left the school thinking the distance was too long. Hence living us in a very dire situation. Others that remained as well failed to pay because some of them were out of their jobs.

Hence to keep the school running I had to sell a vehicle I had just bought from Japan. Later on my son had to sale his plot and the house he had started building for eleven million. My daughter a medical Doctor had to support us with three million shillings. We tried to put in all we could to survive. Your support has been growing steadily and has been a great help to the school and brought in a great relief.

The continuous removal of some pupils from school due to failure to pay the affordable fees on time has led to a performance that I may call very average. The morale of teachers was very low due to delays in salary payment and we have been losing some teachers each year. We have held on to the hope that all will be well. That children will get one of the best education offered at an affordable fee.

We are very grateful for the support you give us. The roofing of the school, bus repair and test funds that you wire. It is a great gesture of kindness but I know you would like the school you support to have the best results. Yes it is very possible with the support we get from you.

I just do not know the way forward as sometimes I think deeply about the future of the school and the children. There are many thoughts that race my mind. So far we have put in a lot as a family. The school has taken almost every precious thing we had but what does the future hold? Whatever the future holds our commitment to serving humanity through teaching children and securing their future with hope will never die. It is a mission that despite the hurdles it makes us very happy. There are a lot of children that need assistance to make it.

Sometimes I wonder will this not be a burden to our friends assisting us out of sincere hearts and with good will?

The future has questions without answers but we are still hopeful that all will be well.
